The architecture bears testimony to this fact. Jogesh Chandra Chaudhuri College is a grants—in—aid college of the Government of West Bengal. The Principal and Teachers are appointed by the recommendation of West Bengal College Service Commission (WBCSC). #### STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

The college strives to provide the students with as many facilities as possible in an endeavour to help them reach their full potential.

#### • Library

**Central Library:** The Central Library of the College has a stock of 29,989 books (text and reference). A photocopier machine and internet services are available in the Library.

**e-library:** The Library website gives access to Online Resources such as **N-List**. Also, the stock of Books can be searched online with **OPAC**.

**Reading Room:** There is an adjoining capacious reading room which the students are free to use during college hours.

**Collaboration with Other Libraries:** The Library has Institutional Membership of the American Centre Library and the British Council Library. A *MoU* has been signed with Behala College for exchange and sharing of library facilities.

**Departmental Libraries:** Several departments maintain separate departmental libraries.

**Book bank:** Some of the Departments maintain Book Banks to lend books to needy students.

#### • NCC

Students of our College, both male and female, are enrolled into Company 3, under the 31<sup>st</sup> Bengal Battalion. Captain Dr. Bipradas Rit is the associated N.C.C. officer of this Company. The NCC unit participates in several social activities and also has won team and individual laurels from the Kolkata Police, Calcutta University and Central Government.

#### • NSS

The year 2008 marks the inception of the National Service Scheme in our college. Presently four units headed by professors are in operation. The team works throughout the year to give training on social service to volunteers regarding developmental issues such as disaster management, environment, child rights, etc. Volunteers spread message regarding the same in the neighboring under-developed regions.

#### • Students' Insurance

We have also covered each student under Personal Accident Insurance Scheme for Rs. 50,000/- from 2002.

#### • Students' Concession

To motivate meritorious students, the college has launched a student concession scheme. Students securing A<sup>+</sup> grade in the first or second semester shall have tuition fee waived for the next semester. Any student who holds first class first position at the completion of the three year degree course shall be entitled to Rs.10, 000/- as prize money. Students with successful academic attainment and minimum attendance of 60% (provided the student did not avail any previous scholarship) can apply for concession of tuition fee.

#### • Canteen & Cheap Store

There is a food corner at which quality food is available to the students. Also there is a cheap store at which all kinds of educational stationary are available at a subsidized price during the college hours.

#### • Cultural activities

The Co-Curricular Committee runs with the purpose of grooming students' personalities through nurturing their cultural talents. Throughout the year the Co-Curricular Committee organizes several programmes like Inter-College Quiz Competitions, Debate and Extempore Competitions. The Annual Prize Day Programme is celebrated each year with attractive cultural programmes involving students in dance, songs and drama. Teachers and students jointly participate in the programmes organized on Republic Day, Independence Day, Teachers' Day, Bhasha Divas, Basanta Utsav and the College Social. The Students of the College have participated and won prizes in several State Level Competitions. The College and the Committee constantly endeavors to create a non-biased multicultural space where students from varied cultural and linguistic backgrounds can make contributions. Cultural interactions strengthen the bond between teachers and students beyond the classroom and inculcate a healthy and harmonious atmosphere in the College.

#### Yoga and Aerobic Classes

Yoga and Aerobic Classes are held regularly in the College under the guidance of a Trained Instructor. The World Yoga Day is regularly observed in the college.

#### RTI cell

The RTI cell aims to empower all and promote transparency and accountability in every aspect in this college. Matters pertaining to the cell are discussed and addressed regularly.

#### • SC/ST/OBC cell

The cell has been created to look after the general welfare of the SC/ST& OBC Students of the college. The cell communicates the information about the State Government and UGC's orders on various aspects of education, scholarship and employment for the SC/ST & OBC students.

#### • Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The primary activities of the cell include:

The Annual Picnic is organised by the Students' Council.


